DAILY DRESSING CARE □ Wash hands before each dressing change. □ Change the bandage once daily. □ Remove the bandage □ Gently cleanse the wound with soap (Dove, Cerave, Ceta □ Try to clean off any crust or debris. □ Then apply a THICK layer of ointment (mupirocin prescri □ COVER the wound with a bandaid / telfa and tape. □ Continue wound care daily until suture or staple removal. THINGS TO AVOID □ Avoid strenuous activities such as exercise, bending, lifting more wound or raise your blood pressure and result in infection or blee □ Avoid submerging the wound such as taking a bath, swimming or □ Avoid smoking which can delay wound healing.	ding complications.
DISCOMFORT: □ Keeping the area elevated in the first 48 hours will decrease swel □ You may ice the area for 10 -15 minutes every hour for the first 20 □ For pain, take Tylenol (acetaminophen) every 6 hours. □ Avoid alcohol and ibuprofen or other NSAIDs for 3 days. □ DO NOT stop aspirin if you currently take a daily aspirin.

□ Signs of infection include increasing pain, redness, swelling, drainage, red streaks, or fever. If you develop a fever or

red streaking, go to urgent care or the emergency room immediately.

□ If you experience any signs of infection, call the office right away during working hours.
