

Wound Care Instructions Shave Biopsy

Dr. Domingues performed a Shave Biopsy.

INITIAL DRESSING CARE

Initial dressing stays in place for 24 hours. Keep the dressing dry.
After you remove the initial dressing, you may shower.

DAILY DRESSING CARE

□ Wash hands before each dressing change.

- □ Change the bandage once daily.
 - □ Remove the bandage
 - □ Gently cleanse the wound with soap and water.
 - □ Then apply a **THICK** layer of ointment (Aquaphor or Vaseline). Do not apply topical antibiotics unless instructed.
 - □ Cover the wound with a bandaid.

□ Keep wound **GREASY** with ointment and **COVERED** at all times until healed. It may take a few weeks until fully heals.

BLEEDING:

□ If light bleeding occurs, apply direct pressure over the wound for 20 minutes with a clean cloth.

□ If bleeding continues, repeat this cycle two more times.

DISCOMFORT:

□ Keeping the area elevated in the first 48 hours will decrease swelling and discomfort.

□ You may ice the area for 10 -15 minutes every hour for the first 24 – 48 hours while awake.

□ For pain, take Tylenol (acetaminophen) every 6 hours.

□ Avoid alcohol and ibuprofen or other NSAIDs for 3 days.

DO NOT stop aspirin if you currently take a daily aspirin.

INFECTION:

- □ Signs of infection include increasing pain, redness, swelling, drainage, red streaks, or fever. If you develop a fever or red streaking, go to urgent care or the emergency room immediately.
- □ If you experience any signs of infection, call the office right away during working hours.
